## Section 2: Hazards Identification

## **Emergency Overview**

Appearance & Odor: Red liquid, petroleum solvent odor

DANGER

Combustible. Harmful or Fatal if Swallowed.

As defined by OSHA's Hazard Communication Standard, this product is hazardous.

#### **Potential Health Effects:**

EYE: May cause mild eye irritation. Symptoms include stinging, tearing and redness.

SKIN: Can cause skin irritation. Prolonged or repeated contact may dry the skin.

Symptoms may include redness, burning, drying and cracking of the skin, burns and other skin damage. Passage of this material into the body through the skin is possible, but it is unlikely that this would result in harmful effects during normal

use.

INHALATION: Breathing small amounts of this material during normal handling is not likely to

cause harmful effects. Breathing large amounts may be harmful. Symptoms include irritation of the nose, throat and airways. Extended exposure may lead to central nervous system depression, including dizziness, drowsiness, weakness,

fatigue, nausea, headache and unconsciousness.

INGESTION: Ingestion may cause gastrointestinal disturbance, including irritation, nausea,

vomiting and diarrhea. The major health threat of ingestions occurs from the danger of aspiration of liquid drops into the lungs, particularly from vomiting. Aspiration may result in chemical pneumonia, severe lung damage and even

death.

CHRONIC EFFECTS: Prolonged or repeated exposure to vapors may lead to central nervous system

effects.

TARGET ORGANS: Exposure to this material (or a component) has been found to cause kidney

damage in male rats. The mechanism by which this toxicity occurs is specific to

the mail rat and the kidney effects are not expected to occur in humans.

#### **Section 4: First Aid Measures**

Eye Contact: Immediately flush with plenty of water for 15 minutes. Call a physician if irritation persists.

Skin Contact: Remove contaminated clothing and wash affected area with soap and water. If skin is

damaged, seek immediate medical attention. If skin is not damaged and symptoms persist,

seek medical attention. Wash contaminated clothing prior to re-use.

Inhalation: Remove person to fresh air. Keep person calm. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If

breathing is difficult give oxygen. Call a physician.

Ingestion: Do NOT induce vomiting. Do not give liquids. Obtain immediate medical attention. If

spontaneous vomiting occurs, lean victim forward to reduce the risk of aspiration. Monitor for

breathing difficulties. Mouth can be rinsed to dissipate the taste.

Note to Physicians: Treat symptomatically. This product contains 2-Butoxyethanol which, if ingested in significant

quantities, may result in red blood cell hemolysis.

absorbents into proper waste containers.
